

Minimally Invasive Neurosurgery

The journal *Minimally Invasive Neurosurgery* (MIN) is a high quality forum for neuroendoscopy, minimally invasive neurosurgery, intraoperative imaging and associated technological advances. The journal is an international journal, published in 6 issues per year, and it is indexed in MEDLINE, Current Contents (CM), Science Citation Index, EMBASE, and SCOPUS.

General Policy

The language of publication of MIN is English and only manuscripts in English will be considered. Manuscripts written by authors whose mother language is not English should be checked by an English native speaker before submission. Manuscripts that do not meet acceptable language standards will be returned to authors. Manuscripts should contain title, abstract and keywords.

All submissions are subjected to a **peer review process**. Only papers of the highest scientific relevance that meet generally recognized linguistic standards will be accepted. The editors alone possess the right to accept or reject an article.

Submission of a manuscript implies that it represents original research that has not been previously published and that it is not being considered or has been submitted for publication elsewhere (extracts of earlier publications, abstracts, posters etc. must be mentioned). It is expected that the corresponding author holds **the copyright to the text and all illustrations** (photographs, graphics, etc.).

Please note that for the publication of **illustrations/photographs** in which a person can be recognized the **written consent of the respective person** must be submitted to the publisher. Suitable forms can be downloaded from <http://www.thieme.de/fz/min> under the item "Forms" in the left hand toolbar. The legal requirements for "unrecognizable" are extremely strict; it should not be possible for the pictured person's closest relatives to recognize the subject.

If illustrations have been copied from books or other journals, the author must apply and be granted **permission for the reproduction**. In addition, the exact source of the material must be cited. If at all possible please use your own unpublished graphic material.

The corresponding author must declare that the manuscript is submitted on behalf of all co-authors and that all named authors have participated in the work to be published in MIN.

In cases of **clinical or experimental studies** with human subjects the study protocol has to be assessed and approved by a responsible ethics committee. In cases of **animal experiments** it is expected that the appropriate animal protection regulations have been followed.

Any **conflicts of interest** must be stated upon submission of the manuscript. A conflict of interest is given when one or more of the authors has a connection (e.g., consultant, advisor, share- or stockholder) with a company whose product is named in the article or other commercial enterprise that markets a similar product. The presentation of the topic must be neutral without any recommendations for a specific commercial article.

With the submission of the manuscript the authors accept the **Instructions for Authors of the journal**.

Copyright is transferred to the publisher upon acceptance of the manuscript.

The author accepts in advance any necessary **editing of the manuscript** (including figures). The editors reserve the right to make any necessary changes or shortening in consultation with the authors.

Manuscript Types

Authors are invited to submit the following types of paper for consideration: Original Article, Review Article, Case Report, Technical Note, Letter to the Editor, Editorials, Consensus Statements, Historical Articles.

Abstract

2500 characters including spaces and symbols with the following structure: Background, Patients/Material and Methods, Results and Conclusion.

3 – 6 Keywords

Main Document

This consists of the sections Introduction, Patients/Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, if necessary Acknowledgements, Conflict of Interest, and List of References. Subheadings in the individual sections improve the legibility of the manuscript. Product names (indicate by appropriate symbol, ® or TM) must be denoted as such at the first use. This also holds for the naming of the manufacturer of preparations and apparatus. In the subsequent text use of the generic name is to be preferred.

- ▶ **Introduction:** The introduction should provide an entry into the discussed topic and outline the current state of knowledge.
- ▶ **Patients/Material and Methods:** The employed methods should be described in such a way that they can be reproduced by an experienced reader. If the methods have been described in detail in previous publications, a brief but comprehensible description is sufficient. For clinical studies the design of the study must be stated explicitly (e.g. prospective, randomized, cohort, etc.) and also the manner and art in which patients were enrolled in the study must be given.
- ▶ **Results:** The results should be presented in a detailed but neutral manner. Tables, figures or video clips may be used when they contribute to a better understanding of the results. Interpretation of the results belongs in the Discussion section.
- ▶ **Discussion:** In this section the most important results of the work are emphasized and discussed. The discussion contains comments on the significant of the work and comparisons with the results of other authors. The strengths and weaknesses as well as difficulties of the study should be mentioned here.
- ▶ **Conclusion:** The conclusion summarizes the most important results of the work.
- ▶ **Acknowledgements:** This lists all people who made contributions to the study as well as all independent organizations (e.g. NIH grants, etc.) that financially supported the work.
Please insert the conflict of interest in the appropriate text box of the online submission system and delete them from the main document.
- ▶ **Conflict of Interest:** Any conflict of interest must be stated when connections to a company (e.g., advisor, consultant, share- or stockholder, etc.) exist whose

product is named in the article or to a company that markets a similar product. Please insert the conflict of interest in the appropriate text box of the online submission system and delete them from the main document.

- ▶ **Reference List:** The reference list should be limited to important recent publications. Only those articles cited in the text may be included in the reference list. The references are indicated in the text, tables and illustrations by Arabic numbers in square brackets. The list of references is placed at the end of the article and lists the references in order of their appearance in the text. For articles with more than 3 authors the term "et al." is placed after the third author.
- ▶ **Figure Legends:** Please collect all figures and table captions in a list at the end of the main document.

Technical Notes

Short communications on technical developments or tips and tricks, new operative techniques, technical aspects of operations or devices.

Length: 1 - 3 printed pages (4500 - 13500 characters including spaces and symbols) together with figures (1 figure corresponds to 1125 characters) but not including reference list with a maximum of 10 references. May include a structured abstract and keywords.

Letter to the Editor

Letters to the Editor should be submitted via the online submission system.

Length: 1 printed page (4500 characters including spaces and symbols) together with figures (1 figure corresponds to 1125 characters) but not including reference list with a maximum of 5 references. The Letter should refer to an article recently published in the journal. When submitting your manuscript, please enter "n/a" into the abstract and keyword boxes as these are required fields.

General Informations

- ▶ **Proofs:** Proofs will be sent to the corresponding author as a pdf file. The proofs should be checked carefully by the corresponding author who takes full responsibility for the correctness of the version released for printing (this applies particularly to amounts, units, references, etc.). The proofs should be signed and returned to the Production Editor Mrs. Anita Laux (by fax +49 (0)711/8931-371 or by email after scanning the form (Anita.Laux@thieme.de)). The publisher reserves the right to charge the author for unusually extensive or delayed corrections. Further changes by the author at later stages are not possible.

- ▶ **Reprints as PDF:** The corresponding author will receive a pdf file of the published article for his/her personal records and use. He/she is allowed to pass this file on to his/her co-authors for their personal use. Further rights for the handling and use of this pdf file are described in the documents accompanying the page proofs.
- ▶ **Impact Factor:** The current Impact Factor of a scientific journal is calculated from the number of articles from the journal cited in the previous two years.
- ▶ **Copyright:** All rights are held by the publishers, including the right to reproduce all or part of any publication.
