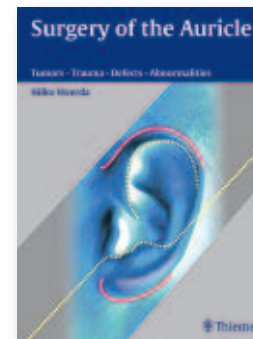

Revision Rhinoplasty is an essential reference for addressing the manifold problems arising from unsuccessful rhinoplasty. Internationally recognized experts provide their recommendations and describe techniques that will help the reader plan and perform a successful secondary rhinoplasty. The book opens by reviewing fundamental concepts of revision rhinoplasty, with thorough discussion of anatomy and functional considerations, as well as strategies for assessing the psychological characteristics of patients, such as the patient's motivations and expectations for surgery, appearance concerns, and psychiatric status and history.
