

Dr. Jennifer Davids is an Associate Professor of Surgery at the University of Massachusetts in Worcester, MA, where she has been on faculty in colon and rectal surgery since 2013. A Massachusetts native, she completed her residency training at Brigham and Women's Hospital and was the inaugural fellow in colon and rectal surgery at UMASS.

Her clinical interests are diverse and include inflammatory bowel disease, surgery for pelvic organ prolapse, advanced endoscopy, and colorectal cancer, with an emphasis on minimally invasive approaches including laparoscopy and robotics. Her research highlights include the study of gender equity in surgery, use of internet and social media by physicians and patients, as well as clinical outcomes research in colon and rectal surgery. She also serves on the editorial board of Diseases of the Colon and Rectum and is an active member of multiple Association of Colon and Rectal Surgery committees and is on the council for the Association of Women Surgeons.
